Internet users in India likely to reach up to 550 mn in 2018: report



- According to a report Internet users in India are likely to reach up to 550 million in 2018, primarily led by affordable access and improved awareness.
- The report further said that Internet-connected urban population will increase from 130 million to 300 million.
- The real action will take place in more-rural areas, where the user base could easily expand by up to 40% per year, from 60 million in 2014 to 280 million in 2018.

Trends in retail technology for 2015

Muti-channel retail - Shoppers want the flexibility to buy online, return in-store and re-order from a mobile, and retailers have to be prepared to offer full service across each of these channels.

Mobility - Having a smartphone may soon become a hygiene factor for retailers. In-store shop assistants carrying tablets/smartphones can help visitors with information, price checks or even check-out to help avoid long queues.

Delivery management - Distributed and networked warehouses enabling offline-pick up of online orders and even drone technology are being explored by warehouses to make delivery effortless.

In-store broadcast - Beacon technology will use bluetooth to beam price and availability information to shoppers with an enabled smartphone app when they pass a mannequin or stroll past a window display.

Cloud for customer - The cloud will be used to put inventory online so that customers will know when a product will hit the shelves. This will boost SKUs and fulfil orders from any location to prevent loss-of-sale.

Google to tweak search algorithm again, 'mobile-friendly' sites will get preference

- Google has changed the way its influential search engine recommends websites on smartphones and tablets in a shift that's expected to sway where millions of people shop, eat and find information.
- The revised formula will favour websites that Google defines as "mobile-friendly." Websites that don't fit the description will be demoted in Google's search results on smartphones and tablets.
